

CITY OF PLANTATION MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL MEMBERS

The following are the minutes of the regular meeting of the City of Plantation conducted at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 24th 2016 at 2502-C Hermitage Way, Louisville, KY 40242.

The following elected council members were in attendance except as noted: Nita James, Lisa Steele. Not attending: Jeanene Clark, Holly Law, Angela Meyerhoffer, and Harvey Gainer. Also present were John Singler, attorney for the City, Charlie Veeneman, accountant for the City and Kenny Betts, Citation Officer. City Clerk Amanda Hess recorded the minutes. All in attendance stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

No Quorum present.

Old Business

Graffiti at LIRC-The City has provided paint to Seven Rueff from LIRC to cover graffiti. Major Stitch from Lyndon Fire and Lt. Cabrera from Metro Police addressed the graffiti.

Major Stitch said the area is an existing fire exit and cannot be closed off, but does recommend that the area remain completely cleared of debris.

Lt. Cabrera will continue using surveillance, will have patrols walk the area each shift, and recommends more lighting in that area behind LIRC; either motion lights or LG&E lights with shields to keep light out of neighbor's back yards. Also suggested we contact the neighbors so they can keep an eye out for vandals.

Ken Fleming-Running for Dr. DeWeese's State Representative seat in next election.

Mark Madison/Road Projects- We have \$30,000 for road projects and it have been recommended that this year we have all of Hermitage Way be repaved as one project for best value.

Kenny Betts-R Future Child Care has been cited for the grass multiple times. The City has contracted for grass cutting and will put a lien on the property.

City Attorney-Google Update-might make it to east end in 2-3 years. Also discussed Metro LG&E Franchise meeting and will be updating us on that.

City Clerk-Getting a lot of tax payments in and recorded.

Mayor-Attended Metro meeting regarding trash/recycling/yard waste pickup. There may be a price increase in pickups due to lack of Metro Louisville residents recycling on a regular basis.
