

CITY OF PLANTATION
MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL MEMBERS

1. The following are the minutes of a meeting of the City of Plantation conducted at 6:00 p.m. on February 27th, 2019 at 2502-C Hermitage Way, Louisville, KY 40242. In attendance at the meeting: Mayor Becky Peak, CM Jeanene Clark, CM Roy Weller, CM Susan Schneider, CM Nita James and CM Holly Law. On roll call, there was a quorum. Also present was John Singler, attorney for the City who recorded the minutes. All in attendance stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.
2. Minutes. Holly Law made a motion to approve, seconded by Nita James and the vote in favor was unanimous.
3. Treasurer's report. Charlie Veeneman presented two months of financials. Holly Law made a motion to approve the treasurer's report, seconded by Susan Schneider and the vote in favor was unanimous.
4. 1st reading of Ordinance 6. Attorney John Singler read the ordinance in summary and explained that Louisville Metro is proposing to raise its insurance premium tax rate. The City of Plantation tax is a set off on tax of Louisville Metro. This means that if Plantation does not raise its rate to match Louisville Metro, Louisville Metro gets the money from the increase. This ordinance would do nothing, unless Louisville Metro Council raises its rate. Holly Law made a motion for introduction and first reading of ordinance 6, seconded by Susan Schneider and the vote in favor was unanimous.
5. Public Forum. The Mayor called on any and all city residents in attendance to address the council and bring any of their questions or concerns to their elected representatives. Several residents commented on various issues of concern to the community.
6. The Attorney for the City, John Singler, reported that until the City had a permanent city clerk, the City Council should consider appointing someone to fill the role of the city clerk on an interim basis. Motion was made by Roy Weller to appoint John Singler as Clerk, seconded by Holly Law and the vote in favor was unanimous.
7. The Mayor discussed reorganizing the layout of the city hall, the search for a permanent city clerk and issues associated with the newsletter.
8. With no further business and without objection, the Mayor closed the meeting at 7:30 p.m.
