



CITY OF PLANTATION
MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL MEMBERS

1. The following are the minutes of a meeting of the City of Plantation conducted at 6:00 p.m. on July 24th, 2019 at 2502-C Hermitage Way, Louisville, KY 40242. In attendance at the meeting: Mayor Becky Peak, CM Roy Weller, CM Holly Law, CM Nita James, CM Susan Schneider. On roll call, there was a quorum. Also present was John Singler, attorney for the City who recorded the minutes. All in attendance stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.
2. Minutes. Motion to approve the minutes by Susan Schneider, seconded by Holly Law and the vote in favor was unanimous.
3. Treasurer's report. Charlie Veeneman went over the fiscal year end treasurer's report. Assuming a few line items can be reclassified, no budget amendment will be needed. Motion to approve the treasurer's report by Holly Law, seconded by Susan Schneider and the vote in favor was unanimous.
4. Old business. The Mayor discussed an incident where a resident demolished a section of sidewalk, the City fixed the area and will charge a cost to the resident. Stop bars are being repainted in various places, along with other traffic marking on the roads. The Mayor reported that the City Clerk resigned, but that she had a candidate to replace her. There was some discussion of whether to advertise for the open position in case the candidate turned out to not want the job. The Mayor also reported that the bills were printed and sent out with the help of some volunteers from Portland Christian School.
5. City attorney. Reported on continuing efforts to collect delinquent taxes, liens will be filed and two foreclosure actions for those most delinquent will be filed.
6. The Mayor reported that the City may finally get a grant from the state of Kentucky for making city sidewalks ADA compatible. The total cost of the project is around \$85,000.00, under this grant the City's portion would only be 20%. The Mayor will continue to work on this grant and try and get all the sidewalks fixed at one time.
7. The Council members commented upon door to door solicitors in the city and on the AT&T fiber optic installations in the area.
8. With no further business and without objection, the Mayor closed the meeting at 6:45 p.m.
