

CITY OF PLANTATION MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL MEMBERS

The following are the minutes of the regular meeting of the City of Plantation conducted at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 23, 2017 at 2502-C Hermitage Way, Louisville, KY 40242.

Also present were John Singler, attorney for the City, Charlie Veeneman, accountant for the City. City Clerk Amanda Hess recorded the minutes. All in attendance stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Action on Financials July 2017-

Motion made by Holly Law; Nita James seconded it. Motion approved as presented.

City Attorney Report-Google Fiber in process. Liens filed for 2016 delinquent taxes.

City Clerk Report-Property taxes are coming in.

Mayor-Reviewed how to make a complaint for code enforcement.

Old Business

Louisville Water Company Project-The project to replace the water main on Hermitage Way is close to completion. The City of Plantation will choose who repaves the street after the end of the project and the Louisville Water Company will reimburse the city for the paving.

Infrastructure Project-Jean Henry will be starting the project to convert sidewalks to handicap-accessible ramps from Bayberry to Westport Road soon.

Funding Announcement- Mayor Peak will be writing a grant for partial funding for the infrastructure project.

Susan Schneider-Kentucky Historical Marker program; shows a history of an area, \$2300-\$2500. City will work towards an application submission for March 1, 2018.

New Business

Review of Select Ordinances-

Driveways-Code Enforcement Officer identified 13 gravel parking pads/driveways in the city that are in violation of the city's parking on a hard surface ordinance. Council discussed taking action on the 13 properties. Council decided to leave the properties alone currently.

Signs (Lost animal, yard sales, etc)-Signs must be free-standing and must be picked up afterwards; cannot be attached to infrastructure. Council discussed fining people for hanging signs and leaving them out. Council decided not to take action on fining residents.
