

CITY OF PLANTATION
MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL MEMBERS

1. The following are the minutes of a meeting of the City of Plantation conducted at 6:00 p.m. on April 24th, 2019 at 2502-C Hermitage Way, Louisville, KY 40242. In attendance at the meeting: Mayor Becky Peak, CM Roy Weller, CM Holly Law CM Nita James. On roll call, there was no quorum. Also present was John Singler, attorney for the City who recorded the minutes. All in attendance stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.
2. Although there is no quorum to conduct business, the Mayor asked those present to exchange information. Treasurer's report. Charlie Veeneman went over the March treasurer's report. Income exceed expenses by \$20,000.00 for the nine months of fiscal year.
3. New business. The Mayor discussed the budget and tax rate ordinance preparation process and went over the budget she had prepared for the meeting and budget massage. The Mayor also went over the tax rate calculation and the additional elder discount the city has historic passed each year. Attendance is important at next month's meeting to do a first reading of the budget and tax rate ordinances.
4. The Mayor called on George Stewart and Lieutenant Hondro Cabrera of Metro Louisville Police to report on ordinance and police enforcement in the City. Stewart notes stepped up enforcement due to Spring and lack of grass cutting, he anticipates more enforcement hours. Hondro Cabrera asked the city to consider striping the non-parking in front of stop signs and other dangerous areas in the city.
5. The Mayor updated the commission on the delinquent tax collection plans for the prior tax years, still have significate number of delinquent taxes and the city is continuing to use a variety of methods to collect.
6. The Mayor reported that by piggybacking on the Metro Louisville annual paving bid, the city is able to pave the entire length of Colonel paved for \$43,000.00, which is way under previous estimates.
7. Holly Law commented on the continuing lack of stopping for stop signed for parents dropping kinds off at Portland Christian School.
8. The Mayor discussed several grants she is writing for the city for various infrastructure projects.
9. With no further business and without objection, the Mayor closed the meeting at 7:05 p.m.
