City Attorney Report-NA

LG&E Meters- LG&E is proposing Smart Meters. The cost of implementing the new technology as well as opting out of the technology will be a cost passed on to the users. Metropolitan Housing Coalition is an intervener on behalf of LG&E users. The PSC has scheduled a meeting to hear users input. The PSC announcement was distributed to the council members.

Waterlines-There was a waterline break at Stonehurst and Malvern Hill recently. Louisville Water Company has repaired it. Mayor Peak stated that is the 4th or 5th break in that area in the last few years.

Hermitage Way entrance will be milled and repaved properly in the next few weeks.

Potholes in the city will be filled as soon as additional material is available.

Cottonwood Project-MSD currently has this project as a priority, however it probably will not happen till the Fall.

Citation Officer Services-Mayor Peak gave an update on some of the work George Stewart has been doing regarding ordinances and citations.

O'Reilly's Auto Parts Store-Still on track to build in current Otte's Nursery location.

Portland Christian has again proposed to lease the undeveloped land that the city owns near LIRC for a playground. There was discussion among the council.
