Pedestrian Mobility Upgrades Coming Soon!

The city council has authorized the mayor to enter into an agreement with KY Transportation Cabinet that provides federal funding for a project to improve walkability in our City! The project, which has been planned and in process since 2012, constructs Americans with Disability Act -compliant walkways across easements at intersections. The City's long-range plan included designating general funds for this project every other fiscal year. Some improvements have been accomplished along Hermitage Way, but much remained undone. This funding will allow us to issue one contract for the complete project. The total project is estimated at almost \$87,000. Federal funding pledged for this project is approximately \$69,600 with the balance of a little over \$17,000 being the City's contribution. We hope that the required competitive process will begin during April and that the entire project will be completed before the start of the 2020-2021 school year.

Do Your Part to Slow the Spread of Coronavirus

You play an important role in protecting yourself, your family, and friends, and your clients from spreading the coronavirus. Like the flu, coronavirus spreads easily from person to person. It spreads mainly through droplets that come from a sick person's nose and mouth when they cough, sneeze, or talk. These droplets can travel up to 6 feet and land in the noses and mouths of people nearby or be inhaled into the lungs. It also can spread when you touch surfaces or objects that have become infected with coronavirus germs.

Take these actions to help slow the spread of coronavirus:

Stay home if you're sick.

If you have a fever, stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone without using medicine that lowers fever.

Respectfully cover your coughs and sneezes.

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue.
- Throw away used tissue when you're done.
- Use your sleeve or elbow if you don't have a tissue.

Intentionally wash your hands often.

- Wash with soap and water for at least 20 seconds (the time it takes to hum the "Happy Birthday" song twice).
- Use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol if you don't have soap and water.
- Wash your hands before touching your eyes, nose, or mouth.

Frequently clean touched surfaces and objects.

- Use soap and water, a bleach and water solution, or disinfectant products to clean items such as handrails and doorknobs. Always follow the directions for usage and disposal on product labels.

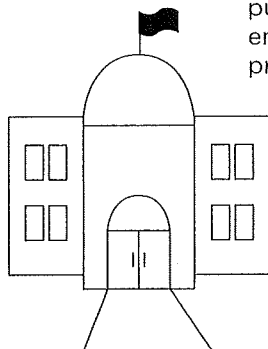
Residents use the census to support community initiatives involving legislation, quality-of-life and consumer advocacy.

Local governments use the census for public safety and emergency preparedness.



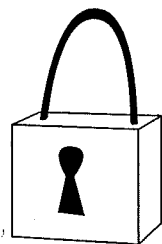
